



# Floral Wreath: CARICOM 51st Anniversary

A floral tribute ceremony at the sarcophagus of the Liberator Simón Bolívar in the National Pantheon of Caracas marked the 51st anniversary of the Caribbean Community (CARICOM). The event included participation from the embassies of CARICOM countries accredited in Venezuela.

Raúl Li Causi, Vice Minister for the Caribbean of the Ministry of Popular Power for Foreign Affairs, attended alongside the ambassadors of Haiti, Trinidad and Tobago, Suriname, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Barbados, Guyana, and Antigua and Barbuda. CARICOM, established on July 4, 1973, with the signing of the Treaty of Chaguaramas, aims to consolidate the unity of its 15 member states and 5 associate members. The event celebrated the ongoing commitment to strengthening cooperative ties between Venezuela and CARICOM member countries.

# **Visit to Rotary Medical Center in Nueva Esparta State.**

The Rotary Medical Center serves over 1,400 people monthly and is self-funded through members and partners of Rotary International. However, the Center currently lacks an Immunization Center, prompting an initiative to form an alliance with Rotary Guyana to share experiences and exchange ideas and visions to further strengthen Rotary services in both nations.





# Visit to the Regional Youth Symphony Orchestra, directed by Maestro Ecberth Lucena in Nueva Esparta

# Consular Visit: Guyanese diaspora in Juan Griego, Nueva Esparta State




Mr. Daniel Achuelos Davis (Communications Officer)
